HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHT

In April 1824, Dilucenne Stoughton and his wife Sophronia left their home in Niagara County, New York to settle in the wilderness of the Michigan Territory. Dilucenne was 39 and Sophronia was 35. Their two sons and two daughters aged 10, 7, 3 and 1 traveled with them in a wagon pulled by a team of horses. The couple would have eight more children born in Michigan.

Their first stop would have been the Detroit Land Office to purchase 80.86 acres on the east side of Franklin road near the river. The land was \$1.25 an acre. The Stoughtons made a cash payment of \$63.08 and a note on the bank of Michigan for \$38.00. They received their land deed a year later in 1825 signed by President John Quincy Adams.

In June of 1824, Elijah Bullock and his wife Rachel, also of Niagara County, New York, would journey to Oakland County, Michigan. Their four sons, daughter Naomi and her husband George Gage would journey with them. Bullock purchased 80 acres on the west side of Franklin road also for \$1.25 an acre. Eventually, he would buy another 160 acres. His property extended from 14 Mile to Scenic Drive and west of Franklin road to Inkster.

Both families built their log homes and put down roots in the Stoughton Bullock Settlement.
